The Invitation to the Table

One: This is not a Presbyterian table – it is for all members of the church universal. This is not a table only for adults – children may partake in the Sacrament with guidance from those around them. This is not a table for those who have not sinned – for no one would eat.

All: We come to this table, not because we must, but because we may. We come to testify not that we are righteous, but that we sincerely love our Lord Jesus Christ and desire to be his true disciples. We come, not because we are strong, but because we are weak. We come to this table, not because of any goodness of our own, but because we need God's mercy and help. We come to this table not to testify that we are righteous, but to sincerely declare that we love God.

One: Beloved Children of God, come to the table of our Lord. All are welcome here...
