In recent years we introduced the WORSHIP<sup>+1</sup> program. **WORSHIP**+1 encourages MPC members and friends to engage in worship **plus one** more activity or program at MPC. This initiative continues to be successful as ever since its introduction there has been an increase in engagement in our committees and programs.

Modeled after the success of Worship+1, on April 7 we will launch: GIVING +<sup>\$</sup>5.

As you know, we entered 2024 with a deficit budget of \$53,899 (okay, you might not have know the exact number). This budget reflects our commitment to an increase in programming and staffing that will help us carry out our mission of being More People Caring, fulfill our Matthew 25 initiative, and seek to make a difference in the world from the corner of Shepherdstown and Simpson.

The good news is, we've done the math! If everyone who gives to MPC, adds just \$5 per week to their offering beginning April 7 (\$195 for the year) we will cover the deficit! ## A Spiritual Spring

"I am not saying there is an easy solution to our ambivalent relationship with God. Solitude is not a solution. It is a direction. The direction is pointed to by the prophet Elijah, who did not find [God] in the mighty wind, the earthquake, the fire, but in the still, small voice; this direction, too, is indicated by Jesus, who chose solitude as the place to be with his Father. Every time we enter into solitude we withdraw from our windy, earthquaking, fiery lives and open ourselves to the great encounter.

The first thing we often discover in solitude is our own restlessness, our drivenness, and compulsiveness, our urge to act quickly, to make an impact, and to have influence; and often we find it very hard to withstand the temptation to return as quickly as possible to the world of 'relevance.' But when we persevere with the help of a gentle discipline, we slowly come to hear the still, small voice and to feel the gentle breeze, and so come to know the Lord of our heart, soul, and mind, the Lord who makes us see who we really are." ~ Henri J.M. Nouwen, from "Clowning in Rome."

Henri Nouwen (1932-1996) was a Catholic priest from the Netherlands. He was especially passionate about social justice work and spirituality, and he saw the two as interrelated. Spirituality (our personal connection with God) inspires our social justice work (our connection with God's people). In Nouwen's reflection above, he makes some key points about spirituality.

1: Spirituality isn't easy. We live in a world full of distractions. We are often restless and unfamiliar with practicing spirituality and contemplation.

2: But, spirituality is important. Our relationship with God can often feel ambivalent or complicated. Sometimes, we do not feel God's presence or understand God's ways. Spiritual practices can help direct us to God's still small voice.

There are many, <u>many</u> different types of spiritual practices, including meditation, daily devotions, fasting, breath prayer, yoga, journaling prayer, connecting with nature, etc. My journey with spirituality and spiritual practices has been a long one. I often become frustrated when I feel like a spiritual practice does not "work" for me. My advice is to keep seeking, keep trying new practices until one feels right for you.

MPC has many ongoing and upcoming opportunities to explore spiritual practices! Every Sunday during worship we observe a selah moment, which is an opportunity for personal meditation. There is the Pastors' Bible Study that meets every Thursday at noon. And, on April 27<sup>th</sup>, you are invited to join us for a day-long Spiritual Retreat (see below). - Pastor Emily

Accidents and spills are a daily part of kindergarten life for the 300 full day students at the Mechanicsburg's Kindergarten Academy.

Parents are requested to keep a change of clothing in their child's backpack, but that request is not always followed.



The school nurse tries to maintain an inventory of underwear, socks, sweatpants, and shorts for when the child does not have a change of clothing, but she does not have a budget for these items.

How would you like to hang out in a kitchen with a fun group while prepping some delicious foods to help a local group home for adults with intellectual disabilities?


Then we welcome you to Presby Peelers! This wonderful group of volunteers began in 2012 with members and friends of MPC. The program has grown over the years and evolved into a weekly event that runs from July through mid-Nov. Here's the low-down.

Each Wednesday, a group of 6-7 volunteers meet at Cumberland Vista House (a part of the CROSS program), which is a house between Mechanicsburg and Dillsburg, from 9-11am. A "team leader" decides on recipes to prep each time. We prepare donated produce from Oak Grove Farms and Spiral Path, along with meats, poultry or fish, into casseroles, salads, sides, or desserts for the residents to eat that week or freeze for future meals.

Our work is very much appreciated by the staff at Cumberland Vista and the residents. It truly is a joy to serve. We have prep jobs for all cooking abilities and physical limitations, so, yes, you can do this!!! No, you don't need tons of experience, just a willingness to help others by making them something to eat. You can volunteer as little or as much as you wish and fits your schedule. 
