Beloved Children of God,

I can't help but be excited as we head into 2024!

This will be our first full year with Pastor Emily on board. She has already made an impact with service trips, programming, and worship. She has also provided connection opportunities locally including a Game Night that is coming up in March and *Courageous Conversations*, an enterprising invitation to talk with other area congregations and denominations about some of the topics that can divide us.

Something to get on your calendar is how QUICKLY Lent and Easter will arrive this year. Ash Wednesday is on February 14. Easter is almost as early as it can get on March 31 (also my Mom's birthday, fyi).

Of course, I'm excited about this year because this is the year of SABBATICAL! We will be providing more details as we get closer, but thanks to a sabbatical grant, my sabbatical begins with a catered kick-off brunch after worship on Sunday, June 2. I will return to the office on Tuesday, September 3. There will be another catered meal at MPC after worship on Sunday, September 8 to celebrate the conclusion of the sabbatical. On September 15, I will return to the pulpit.

Although Pastor Emily and Cathay will do a lot of the worship leadership, we will have guest pastors come and join us as well. We are also going to invite the retired pastors in our midst to share their good word with us.

The sabbatical revolves around the theme of sabbath and MPC will be able to participate in experiencing sabbath as well. There will be more information about what that entails as we move through the year.

As for me, there are three major components to the sabbatical. I will be going on a week-long silent retreat, where I will work with a spiritual director who will then continue with me for the next two years. The second component is Martha and I have rented a house in Maine where we will spend a month, and be with all of our family together for at least 1 of those weeks.

The third component is the one I am most intrigued about. Martha and I will take a trip out to Boise, Idaho where a colleague of ours serves a church that takes sabbath once a month. On

There are no meetings. The congregation is invited to take that Sunday as a sabbath. I'm looking forward to finding out more about that and maybe bringing it home to MPC.

I love the turn into a new year, and all of the promise it brings. How about you? Let me know. I'm looking forward to hearing about your dreams and plans for 2024.


The Thoughtful Christian Class (TTC), meets in Upper Fellowship Hall, Sundays @ 9:35 AM



The Safety Committee's mission is to promote a safer environment when we are gathered for worship. Everyone at MPC plays a role in our overall safety efforts.



An emergency can be defined as any situation that poses an immediate risk to safety, health, life, and property. It is any unexpected, serious, or dangerous situation requiring immediate action. We cannot predict when an emergency situation will occur which makes it difficult to plan for every potential circumstance.

In any emergency, no matter what kind, these steps should always be followed:

- Stay calm
- Trust your instincts (If you see something, say something)
 - Call 9-1-1
 - Get yourself and others to safety

Protecting the health and safety of everyone at MPC should be our first priority.
