From the Associate Pastor

Women in Scripture

March 1st marks the first day of Women's History Month, a month dedicated to celebrating women's contributions to history. We celebrate women including, Ella Baker (American civil rights leader), Sally Ride (first American woman in space), Ruth Bader Ginsberg (first Jewish woman to serve on the Supreme Court and the second woman to ever serve), Kamala Harris (current vice President), and all the influential women in our lives. We also celebrate spiritual ancestors, women who played pivotal roles in the history of the Hebrew people, Jesus' ministry, and the establishment of the early church. In the Bible, there are approximately 200 named women and more than 600 unnamed women. We uplift some of their stories:

Old Testament

Deborah: the only female judge mentioned in the Bible. She is also called a prophetess and a military leader of Israel. Deborah was faithful to God and her leadership ushered in 40 years of peace in Israel. (Judges 4-5)

Daughters of Zelophehad: advocated for women's right to inherit land. After Zelophehad's death, his five daughters went to Moses and declared that they should be permitted to inherit their father's property. When Moses brought their case to God, God declared, "The daughters of Zelophehad are right." (Numbers 27:1-11)

Esther: became queen of Persia and used her influence to save her people from death. She was a Jewish woman who, after learning of the court official, Haman's, plan to kill all the Jewish people, risked her own life by approaching the king and exposing the plot. Her intelligence and bravery saved her people. (Book of Esther)

Huldah: a prophetess whose confirmation of a religious text's holiness sparked religious reform. When King Josiah ordered the Jewish temple to be renovated, a priest found the Book of the Law (Moses' laws) in the old temple. The priest brought the book to Huldah who confirmed that the text was holy and warned Josiah to pay attention to the book's words prompting Josiah to institute religious reform throughout the kingdom. (2 Kings 22-3)

New Testament

Lydia: a successful businesswoman and the first recorded convert to Christianity in Phillippi. After her conversion, she provided hospitality and generosity to Paul and his companions. (Acts

16:11-15)

Samaritan Woman at the Well: defied cultural and religious norms by talking with Jesus (a man from a different religious community). She shared the news of Jesus as the promised Messiah to her community. (John 4)

Susanna: a woman who accompanied Jesus after being healed by him. She provided financial support for Jesus' ministry out of her own resources. (Luke 8:1-3)

Tabitha (also called Dorcas): described as a disciple of Christ who was devoted to good works and acts of charity. The impact of her death on her community was so great that the people called for Peter to come without delay to revive her. (Acts 9:36-42).


We want to share the following note that was recently received in the Mission & Student Center's mailbox. It was mailed from the Lehigh Valley and included a small donation:

Preschool Place: Spring is around the corner, hopefully!?


Our preschoolers are excited to get outside regularly and be in the fresh air, the sunshine, and run around like crazy. Spring at preschool means special activities for reading month, getting in the dirt planting flowers or beans, and parent-teacher conferences for our Big Learners (3s, 4s, 5s). A huge amount of growth happens at preschool, and we love to share what we see with parents.

We have been holding our annual St Paddy with Daddy* event for more than 25 years (apart from 2 years during COVID). This year we are doing it again on March 14th. Children bring their Dads* (*or other fatherly figures like uncles, grandpas, brothers...) to an evening of music and fun. By fun we mean dancing to the tunes of Mr. Music himself, Lenny Tepsic. Mr. Music plays his guitar and sings a variety of songs where participation is a must. He encourages the children to sing along and gets the grownups singing and dancing too. We document the dancing with tons of photos! A selfie photo station and sweet treat bring the evening to a close with big smiles all around.

We celebrate National Reading Month by setting goals to read more each day and holding our annual book drive during the week of March 4th. Feel free to drop off a new or gently used children's book in my office. We will include them in our donation to those in need. Our ongoing focus is to motivate children to read (or be read to) every day of the year, even our littlest ones. Research findings from the National Early Literacy Panel highlight the fact that literacy skills begin to develop at birth. That's cool!

Your Fellowship Committee is sponsoring an Easter craft event, making Ukrainian Easter Eggs.






Please register by April 30, 2024.

The leak was causing steam to rise, creating condensation, that then dripped onto the ceiling tiles. We think this has been fixed, but there continue to be leaks in the building.
- We are getting the tower doors that lead in and out of the Sanctuary replaced. This will cost \$24,000—donations are welcome!
- The Valentine's Square Dance had over 80 people in attendance and was a huge success. We are already working with the caller to set up the next one!
- We closed our time together with the sharing of joys and concerns, prayer, and the singing of the *Gloria Patri*.

The next time you are in worship, take notice of the card in the pews titled, Sanctuary Evacuation Plan. Anytime you are in the sanctuary, we encourage you to familiarize yourself with where you are seated and the nearest exit(s) including those that are wheelchair accessible. You should also review the instructions and guidance for evacuating the sanctuary including our reunification area at the Student & Mission Center.

Each time we conduct an evacuation drill of the sanctuary, the Safety Committee incorporates what we learn into the church's overall emergency plan. This drill is an annual exercise during the summer.

MPC Volunteers with HERCO Continue to Raise Money for Mission in 2024


